for the Graduate Certificate in Accounting Foundations (online)

The Accounting Foundations Graduate Certificate combines technical knowledge in financial and managerial accounting with professional competencies in critical thinking, communication, leadership, and strategic decision-making. Students will study the principles, concepts, and methods used to record and report the transactions and activities of a business entity, as well as the tools and processes to analyze accounting information. Students will also apply their knowledge to practical, real-world problems via experiential learning opportunities. Career opportunities for students who complete the Accounting Foundations Graduate Certificate include positions in audit and assurance services, corporate accounting, taxation, consulting and advisory services, and in governmental and not-for-profit entities.
