

INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION ADMINISTRATION AND LEADERSHIP, CERT

for the Graduate Certificate in International Education Administration and Leadership

International Education Administration & Leadership certificate, requiring 12 credit hours of coursework, trains professionals to lead, develop, implement and evaluate international programming and internationalization activities in business/industry and education sectors, including postsecondary settings, in both private and public sectors. Students may choose from among the courses listed to specialize in any of the areas of internationalization, and may elect a global education abroad program and/or an internship in order to develop expertise in a particular region or skill set. The institution has a long history of training international education specialists through Global Studies in Education and other related programs. Indeed, the institution itself is renowned for its own international education programming and leads the world in innovation in this field. The CERT allows students to document specific expertise for employers by highlighting participation in skill building and practitioner focused coursework. Upon completing the CERT, students will be able to:

- Critically and effectively engage in international program administration and leadership.
- Lead institutions in a changing, complex global environment through well-informed international policy and practice.
- Excel in international education careers across multiple sectors of the international education field, including programming and administration, managing study abroad programs, administering international student services, directing student services in ESL and intensive language programs, and directing government or private programs that support international education and engagement.
- Face emerging challenges within internationalization development.
- Respond to various challenges, including shifting political dynamics, increased health and safety issues, and imperatives to expand learning modalities from face-to-face to virtual settings.
- Facilitate and manage internationalization efforts in business, nonprofit, and education sectors, including postsecondary education.

The Graduate Certificate programs in the Department of Education Policy, Organization and Leadership are designed to meet the academic and professional interests of individuals preparing for careers as academic professionals, adult educators, college professors, corporate trainers, educational policy analysts, governmental administrators, instructional designers/technologists, non-profit representatives, organizational development specialists, and university administration leaders.

Admission

The Department of Education Policy, Organization and Leadership carefully considers all applicants for graduate study. Applicants should consult the department website (<http://education.illinois.edu/epol/admissions/howtoapply/>) for more detailed application information and should apply online at the online application portal

(<http://www.grad.illinois.edu/admissions/apply/>). The quality of the applicant's undergraduate and graduate training and grade point average are primary considerations. Other important factors evaluated include the three letters of recommendation and statement of purpose. International applicants are required to submit proof of English proficiency. Facilities and Resources

The College of Education also has many resources to assist graduate students through their academic career. The Bureau of Educational Research works with students to secure research funding. The Council on Teacher Education entitles candidates seeking a Professional Educator License and provides accreditation of professional education programs. Each student completing a degree program is assigned a graduate advisor, who is available to assist the student with planning the program of study and determining degree requirements, courses and timelines for degree completion.

Graduation Requirements

Minimum Cumulative GPA: 3.0

Minimum hours required for certificate completion: 12 hours

Students who have successfully completed this 12-credit hour certificate may use the certificate to satisfy the following degree requirements, provided they apply and are admitted to the degree program:

- 4 hours of 500-level course required in Education for the EdM degree program at EPOL, and
- 8 hours of Concentration Courses or 400/500-level Courses approved by Advisor for the EdM degree program at EPOL

or

- 4 hours of 500-level course required in Education for the MA degree program at EPOL, and
- 8 hours of 400/500-level Courses approved by Advisor for the MA degree program at EPOL

or

- Up to 12 hours of Major Subject coursework (includes concentration courses) required in Education for the EdD degree program at EPOL, and
- Up to 12 hours of Elective Hours or 400/500-level courses approved by Advisor for the EdD degree program at EPOL

or

- Up to 12 hours of Major Subject coursework (includes concentration courses) required in Education approved by the Advisor for the PhD degree program at EPOL

or

- Up to 12 hours of 400/500-level Courses in Education approved by the Advisor for the CAS program at EPOL
