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Global Studies minors will be able to:

1. Discover how complex, interdependent global systems—natural, environmental, social, cultural, economic, and political—affect and are affected by the local identities and ethical choices of individuals and institutions
2. Develop social scientific skills to explain these interconnections through data collection and analysis, building familiarity with academic literature, and written assignments.
3. Apply knowledge to promote inquiry, discover solutions, and generate new ideas and creative works while enhancing their capacity to conduct independent research.
4. Gain social awareness and cultural understanding through intensive experiential, cross-cultural coursework and advanced language study.
5. Integrate the minor with their current major(s) to add depth and sophistication to their understanding of global interconnections with their primary academic/professional field. The minor will provide a foundation for increased complexity of engagement with interdisciplinary fields, projects, and intellectual inquiry.
